- Trees planted in Jan Mar 2015 period: 88,510
- · Location: Malawi, Africa
- Type of trees: we are focusing mostly on Guava and Papaya trees, both of which grow quickly and provide abundant fruit. Guava trees grow in 4-5 years whilst Papaya trees grow in 2-3 years

Deforestation is still a huge problem

- The Malawians, like many other Africans, have an urgent need to set fire to almost all forests in the belief that it will improve agriculture in the following year
- Farmers indiscriminately cut down trees and set fire to them where they have fallen
- The problem is that only the top soil is fertile and this is inevitably quickly washed away from the steep slopes once the trees have been cut down and cleared
- Although not the entire solution, growing new fruit trees helps to educate communities about trees and their economic value
