- **Type of trees:** we are mostly focusing on Guava and Papaya trees, both of which grow quickly and provide abundant fruit. Guava trees grow in 4-5 years whilst Papaya trees grow in 2-3 years

- The scale of destruction has accelerated in the past three to five years because of the combination of drought, poverty and a growing population
- The demand for wood charcoal and firewood is very high as it is used for cooking and heating in the cities
